Important Notes re: Cost of Attendance

(Master of Science in Resilient and Sustainable Communities program):

- 1) **Tuition is subject to change** with board approval. Modest increases are typical from year to year.
- 2) **Student course fees** vary per course (See Schedule of Classes for details.)
Course fees will be added to cost of attendance after student registration upon student written request to finaid@prescott.edu. Course fees are typical for field courses and art courses. Certain courses that require extensive travel or extra accommodations costs are assigned an additional course fee. Food costs for field courses are usually shared with fellow students. Personal camping and backpacking equipment is required for most field courses. Certain adventure education courses require special personal equipment (e.g., cross-country ski boots and skis or a mountain bike.)
- 3) **Loan fees** may be adjusted to student's actual loan fees upon written request to finaid@prescott.edu.
- 4) A one time per program **computer allowance** up to \$2500 may be added on to a student's cost of attendance upon submission of an actual cost estimate via a student Cost of Attendance petition.
- 5) **Students may appeal** to add-on additional education-related expenses in the event of special circumstances. Examples include childcare expenses, disability-related expenses, first-time professional license fees, exam fees, and additional transportation expenses for field courses. To do so, please:

- 6) **Other occasional fees** not included on p. 1:
Late payment fee: \$25 monthly;
Late registration fee: \$75 per occurrence.
- 7) **Payment Deadlines:**
Tuition must be paid in full or payment arrangements (payment plan or financial aid awards sufficient to cover tuition and fees) must be in place for each term by the following dates:
Fall 2023: July 7th, 2023
Spring 2024: December 1st, 2023
Summer 2024: May 3rd, 2024

Once you have confirmed your intention to enroll you and registered, your bill will be posted in the student portal - My Academic Services. Students are responsible for checking this portal and paying their account balance by the posted deadlines.

Students will not be permitted to participate in Orientation or matriculate from Prescott College until satisfactory payment arrangements are in place.
