

## 2024-2025 Endowed and Donor-Restricted Scholarships

Through the generosity of our donors, Prescott College is pleased to offer several scholarships to assist students with their cost of attendance. Scholarship selection criteria will be based on a combination of academic performance, financial need, and/or intended program of study as designated by each donor. Financial need will be determined based on Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) information. We encourage all students to complete the 2024-2025 FAFSA online at [studentaid.gov](https://studentaid.gov).

To be considered for any of these scholarships, submit the [Endowed and Donor-Restricted Funds Application](#) and supplemental materials via the [on-line application form](#) or via e-mail to the Prescott College Financial Aid Office using one of the contact methods below (email, drop off hard copy, or send via post mail) on or **before Tuesday, March 26<sup>th</sup>, 2024 at 11:59 PM**. No exceptions. Due to the large volume of scholarship applications received, we will send notification letters only to those students who are selected as scholarship recipients. Scholarships will be applied to the student's 2024 Fall and/or 2025 Spring term(s).

<b>Julie Bondeson Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$19,000 (max \$5,000 per person)	Established by Julie Bondeson, to be awarded to any student in good academic standing who demonstrates financial need and is actively pursuing studies in either a sustainable living and/or an environmental program. Four awards are available.
<b>The Boyce Endowed Scholarship Fund</b>	\$2,000	Established by Daniel H. Boyce and Suzanne Boyce to honor the work and mission of their son, Geoffrey Alan Boyce '04 during and after his attendance at Prescott College. This scholarship will be awarded to an undergraduate student(s), with financial need, in recognition of sustained commitment to social and environmental justice and, in particular, innovative work toward tackling issues of regional, community and global justice and sustainability. Any undergraduate student(s) who has declared a competence in this important discipline or who has demonstrated strong interest in these subjects through extracurricular participation is encouraged to apply. When there is more than one particularly outstanding applicant, preference will be given to an On Campus Undergraduate student(s) from a social or racial group that has historically been disempowered and who is a resident of Arizona.
<b>Dugald Bremner Scholarship</b>	\$300	Awarded to a student(s), in any program who is majoring in adventure education or photography.
<b>Changemaker High School Alumni Scholarship</b>	\$15,000 (max \$1000 each)	A special scholarship established in honor of alumni of Changemaker High School in Tucson, Arizona. Preference given to students who are first in their family to graduate from high school and demonstrate financial need. Recipient must be a new admit to Prescott College who recently graduated from Changemaker High School in Tucson. Multiple awards available.
<b>Dorothy Ruth Ellis Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$1,500	Established by Reuben J. Ellis and Linda L. Dove to honor the memory of Dorothy Ruth Ellis to be awarded to an On Campus Undergraduate student(s) in Writing, Literature, and/or Journalism within the Arts and Letters Program. Any Prescott College student working toward a competence in at least one of these areas or any incoming Prescott College student who declares an intention to work towards a competence in at least one of these areas may apply for the Scholarship. Preference will be given to a student whose legal place of residence is southeast Texas (Jefferson, Orange, Tyler, Newton, and Hardin counties) and/or a student who is a member of an ethnic minority group.
<b>The Ebarb Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$2,300 (\$1350 each)	Note: an endowed scholarship application is not required for this scholarship. This scholarship is awarded and divided equally among the student representatives to the Prescott College Board of Trustees. <b>Goodman Scholarship Endowment Fund</b>	\$300	Established by Mark and Gwen Goodman, to be awarded to an undergraduate student(s) who demonstrates financial need and has either declared a competence in law or medicine or demonstrates strong interest in the subject through extracurricular participation.

<b>William Randolph Hearst Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$4,000	Awarded to student(s) studying teacher education with a preference for a Native American student.
<b>Hulmes Legacy Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$2,400	Established by Douglas F. Hulmes '74, to be awarded to an undergraduate student(s) in good academic standing who is actively studying environmental education or to a student(s) who demonstrates an affiliation with the Arizona Wilderness Collaborative Partnership.
<b>Dorothy Hume Bahlmann Memorial Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$1,100	Established in memory of Dorothy Hume Bahlmann by her many friends and family, this scholarship hopes to encourage students who share Dorothy's love of the natural world and are motivated to pass that love along through their academic and career pursuits. Preference will be given to a student who is first in their family to go to college. Applicants must be full-time, undergraduate students pursuing a degree in the Adventure Education, Education, or the Environmental Studies programs.
<b>KAKATU Foundation Scholarship Fund</b>	\$2,100	Established by David Meeks '73 to be awarded to an undergraduate student(s) interested in natural history, environmental education and/or sustainability. Preference will be given to a student(s) who has declared a competence in this important discipline or who has demonstrated strong interest in these subjects through extracurricular participation.
<b>Knaup Family Scholarship Fund</b>	\$2,700 (max \$1350 each)	Established by Warren C. and Marianne Knaup, funds will be awarded equally between men and women and are restricted to full-time On Campus Undergraduate students who demonstrate financial need through the FAFSA, are U.S. Citizens, and who are studying and desire a career in the field of environmental conservation and/or environmental education.
<b>Lovejoy, Rifá, Hulmes Minority Scholarship</b>	\$1,400	Established by Eunice G. Lovejoy, David W. Lovejoy '72, Amparo Rifá '89, and Douglas Hulmes '74 to be awarded to a first-year student with a preference for a student from a diverse ethnic or racial background seeking admission to the on-campus undergraduate program who demonstrates financial need and is in good academic standing.
<b>The Francisco Madero Latin American Studies Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$300	Established via a senior project in 2006, this fund seeks to remember Francisco Madero who was known as the "apostle of Mexican Democracy" and was the first Mexican president after the dictator Porfirio Diaz and the Mexican Revolution. Scholarships from this fund shall support students wishing to study and live in Latin America while applying experiential and service learning.
<b>Bob &amp; Barbara Mariano Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$1,000	Awarded to a student(s) in any program who demonstrates financial need and whose academic work demonstrates excellence and commitment.
<b>The Ruth Morris Memorial Scholarship (aka the Maas Family Scholarship)</b>	\$1,600	Awarded to an Online Undergraduate student(s) who demonstrates financial need with a preference toward a student(s) who identifies as a female.
<b>Ronald C. Nairn Memorial Scholarship</b>	\$6900 (max \$1000 each)	The Ronald C. Nairn Memorial scholarship was established to support Prescott College students and honor the former Prescott College president Ronald C. Nairn. First preference will go to qualifying applicants from Yavapai County who demonstrate financial need. Multiple awards available.
<b>The No Barriers Course Fee Scholarship</b>	\$5,500	The No Barriers Course fee scholarship was started by anonymous donors to support students with financial need for field class course fees. Course Fees can be obstacles to student access to enriching and transformative academic field experiences. Gifts to this scholarship fund are used as quickly as possible as the need arises. <b>Quitobaquito Scholarship</b>	\$1,100	Established by an anonymous family, preference for this award will be given to a Tohono O'odham Native American student(s) in any program who graduated from a secondary school in the Tohono O'odham Nation of Southern Arizona that demonstrates academic passion and commitment. In lieu of a Tohono O'odham applicant, preference the award may be made to any Native American student(s) who demonstrates these qualities.
<b>Dr. Bev Santo Scholarship</b>	\$1,000	Awarded to a Online Undergraduate student(s) who is a single parent, and whose academic work demonstrates excellence and commitment.
<b>Kelly Megan Stack Endowed Scholarship</b>	\$1,900	Established by Anna S. Cook, custodian for Madison Stack UGMA, to be awarded to an undergraduate student(s) studying environmental sciences, natural history, or environmental education.

<b>Helen <span style="color: #00A651;">Wright</span> Memorial Scholarship</b>	\$200	Established in memory of Helen R. Wright by the Alta Vista Garden Club of Prescott, Arizona to be awarded to a student(s) in any program who demonstrates academic excellence and is enrolled in studies of plant biology, field biology or other environmental studies that might emphasize conservation of plant species in particular. First preference is given to a graduate of a Prescott, Prescott Valley or Chino Valley High School.

Any Prescott College On Campus Undergraduate student(s) working towards a competence in the realm of Writing and Literature may apply for the award. For consideration, students should submit <a href="#">writing samples (up to 10 pages)</a> along with an endowed scholarship application.
<b>Roseanne <span style="color: #00A651;">Cartledge</span> Art Scholarship</b>	\$500	<p>The Roseanne Cartledge Arts Scholarship is an annual scholarship awarded to a full-time, continuing student in the On Campus Undergraduate working toward competence or breadth in any area of the Visual Arts. This scholarship is intended to assist the student with art materials expenses. To apply for the scholarship please write <a href="#">a letter</a> addressed to "Dear Scholarship Review Committee". In the letter please address:</p> <ol style="list-style-type: none"> <li>1) The research (or studies) you will be doing in Kino, why they are important to you (and your education) and how they will build on your previous studies (elsewhere and in Kino);</li> <li>2) What if any contribution your project will make to the work done at the Kino Bay Center;</li> <li>3) Your competence and breadth titles and anticipated graduation date.</li> <li>4) Your financial need – why you need money to be able to do the proposed study.</li> </ol> <p>This <a href="#">letter</a> will be attached to the Endowed Scholarship Application under "Attach Other Supporting Documentation Here".</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>The Willis Peterson Photographic Award</b></p>	<p>\$1,000</p>	<p>The Willis Peterson Photographic Award, established by Willis and Roberta Peterson, is fund that will provide scholarship assistance to Prescott College students, in particular students who show promise and insight into seeing the beauty of nature and environmental issues through the medium of photography.</p> <p>A <a href="#">portfolio of eight pictures</a> must be provided via the application. The theme of the pictures should relate to "the beauty of nature and environmental issues."</p>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>The Daniel Roca Interdisciplinary Senior Project Endowed Scholarship</b></p>	<p>\$1,000</p>	<p>Established by Patricia and Neville Henry in honor of their Prescott College alumnus Daniel Roca '12, to assist undergraduate residential degree seeking students who are completing a double competence and have demonstrated that their senior project combines interdisciplinary work in both areas. Preference is given to students with financial need as determined by the Financial Aid Department. In lieu of a qualified applicant seeking a double competence, a student with a interdisciplinary senior project that combines their competence and breath areas of study may be selected. The recipient also must have been enrolled for a minimum of two years.</p> <p>In addition to their scholarship essay, applicants for this scholarship attach the following as supporting documentation:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <a href="#">a description of their senior project</a> including the linkage between the two areas of competence and the significance of this integrated study.</li> </ul>
<p style="text-align: center;"><b>Randy Tufts Memorial Award in Geosciences</b></p>	<p>\$200</p>	<p>The Randy Tufts Memorial Award in Geosciences was established by Dr. Ericha Schott, widow of Randy Tufts, in partnership with Friends of Kartchner Caverns, to recognize an outstanding Prescott College graduate student(s) in the field of Geosciences whose academic and personal interests include exploration, conservation, preservation and the protection of the natural environment. The goal of this award is to encourage and support students who are aligned with the life and mission of Dr. Randy Tufts, co-discoverer of Kartchner Caverns.</p> <p>Any Prescott College student(s) enrolled in the Master of Arts Program with a study emphasis in the broad field of Geosciences may apply for the award. In their scholarship essay, applicants should describe their academic and personal commitments as they relate to the intention of this award. In addition, applicants should submit <a href="#">two letters of recommendation</a> addressing the student's commitment to the study of Geosciences and unofficial copies of <a href="#">graduate transcripts</a>.</p>

For consideration, students should submit <a href="#">either writing samples (up to 10 pages) or digital/video files</a> along with an endowed scholarship application.</p>
